Aviation Management Pilots

Oversees compliance with local, state, and federal rules and regulations. Responsible for keeping inspection schedules and ensuring the upkeep of the airport.

Responsible for transporting passengers or cargo. This includes determining the safest routes, analyzing weather and flight plans, and inspecting the aircraft's navigation and operating systems.

Aircraft Maintenance Technician

Inspects and maintains aircraft with relation to the Federal Aviation Administration regulations and standards.

Air Traffic Control

Coordinates the movement of air traffic to ensure that planes stay a safe distance apart. Monitors and directs the movement of aircraft from Point A to Point B.

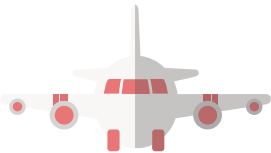
Aerospace Engineer

Airport Construction

Performs airfield sweeping, traffic control, and building maintenance; including changing airfield light bulbs, directing site equipment, and other necessary tasks to upkeep the daily operation of the airport.
